
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






RUSSIA

Torzhok is a town in Tver Oblast, Russia, located on the Tvertsa River along the federal highway. The town is famous for its folk craft of goldwork embroidery. The real allure of Torzhok, however, is in its old city charm. Its left bank between the two bridges is lined with three-story mansions from the 18th century. Above them looms a small hill where the 18th- century Church of the Entry of the Lord Into Jerusalem stands watchful guard over the town.





Immerse yourself in Russian history with a trip to Veliky Novgorod. The town is best known for its incredible medieval churches and monuments, including the 11th century St. Sophia Cathedral.



Petrozavodsk







Post breakfast we start our drive further to Petrozavodsk. Petrozavodsk is a city on the western shore of Lake Onega, in northwest Russia. It's known for the Museum of Fine Arts, which exhibits medieval icons alongside folk art and Russian paintings The city is situated right on the western shore of Lake Onega (the second largest lake in Europe) and is the capital of Karelia.

Petrozavodsk travel is well-worth considering as the natural beauty of Karelia paired with the authenticity of Russian traditions intertwining with the European atmosphere is something to see for yourself.

Activity Day - Visit to Kizhi Island



In the morning we depart on the hovercraft to Kizhi Island on the Lake Onega. Upon arrival in Kizhi we visit the Open Air Museum of Wooden Architecture in Kizhi. This is one of the first open-air museums and one of the most popular tourist attractions in Russia. The main attraction of the museum is the Kizhi Pogost, declared a world heritage site by UNESCO in 1990. On the way back we make a stop near the highest point of Kizhi to enjoy the splendid panoramic view with hot barbeque lunch.

Kizhi Island in winter time is the place of rare beauty! Dark silhouettes of the famous wooden churches of Kizhi on a crispy blanket of white snow look absolutely stunning. It will take two hour to cross the second largest lake in Europe, Lake Onego, and reach Kizhi by hovercraft from Petrozavodsk.

Petrozavvodsk to Ruskeala



We drive from Petrozavodsk to Ruskeala. Ruskeala Mountain Park is the Hidden gem of Karelia. Ruskeala is one of the most outstanding and wonderful places of Nothern Ladoga Lakeside as well as the only complex natural landmark in the mining history. After check in we enjoy a trip to a Banya to rejuvenate ourselves.

Banya is originally a Russian-Eastern Slavic steam bath with a wood stove. It is considered an important part of Russian culture with slavic root. The bath takes place in a small room or building designed for dry or wet heat sessions.

Activity Day - Husky Dogs, ATV & visit to Marble Canyon

We enjoy the breathtaking landscapes of the Karelia forest covered with a white blanket of snow. Also together we enjoy the ride on the ATV . After the lunch we proceed to Marble canyan. Near the village of Ruskeala. There are picturesque marble quarries, which served as a place for the extraction of marble for the cathedrals and palaces of St. Petersburg and other cities. There are ponds surrounded by sheer marble cliffs. The water in these reservoirs has an emerald color. In winter, when it is dark, artistic illumination is turned on. Near the Mountain Park there are the picturesque Ruskeala Waterfalls.

Activity Day - Sherp Car, Snow Mobile & SS tour of St. Petersburg
